Parklands Infants and Nursery School - Remote Learning

At Parklands Infant and Nursery School, we recognise that schools reach beyond the realms of education and can provide a hub for children, families and the community. During periods of closure, we understand the impact that losing contact can have on the wellbeing and safeguarding of young people and families. With this in mind, we would strive to offer the following during any prolonged periods of lockdown.

Blended Learning

A proportion of learning would take place online with some organised live lessons, this would be delivered via a video calling platform, allowing real-time interaction between the teacher and pupils and increase the quality of learning. Work tasks/activities would be set via our website class pages, with instructions and details to support. Links to online activities and information will also be provided.

Family Support

Our Early Help Practitioner would continue their work with families to ensure that they have access to the in-house support and external services that they need, which is even more vital during a period of uncertainty such as a lockdown.

Good Communication

Communication can be difficult when schools are closed (in full or in part) as staff would be less accessible. Parents/carers would be able to continue their communication via phone, email, and ClassDojo. School will maintain lines of communication through email, texts and phone calls.
