 Can you talk about people who look after you at home and at school? Can you say when something has upset you? Can you say when you need to use the toilet or need to clean yourself up? Can you keep equipment in the right area of the Nursery? 	 Can you take part in a game? Can you share and give toys with other children? Can you give the other children and grown ups a smile when talking to them? 	 Can you say goodbye to your mum or dad at the start of the day with a smile? Can you have a go at lots of different activities in the Nursery? 	 Can you look at and listen to a grown up? Can you do what a grown up asks you to? Can you say please and thank you? Can you call the other other children and grown ups by their name? 	 Can you say what you have enjoyed doing at Nursery today? Can you say who your friends are in the Nursery? Can you talk about what makes you happy? 	 Can you play with the toys carefully? Can you 'choose it, use it and put it away?' Can you listen to your friends and grown ups? Can you talk to others in a friendly way?



A Parklands Person in Reception can...

 Can you talk about what to do if you are worried about something? Can you use a computer and the internet when an adult asks you to? Can you look after yourself by washing your hands and blowing your own nose? Can you use classroom equipment safely? 	 Can you take turns and share fairly? Can you think about how your friends might be feeling when working and playing together? Can you talk about which children and grown ups you enjoy working and playing with? 	 Can you take part in new activities which you may not have tried before? Can you talk in front of a group of other children? Can you keep working on a task even when it is difficult? 	 Can you say please and thank you without being reminded? Can you listen to other children and talk about their ideas? Can you sit quietly and listen to grown ups when appropriate? (visitors, assemblies, story time). 	 Can you talk about what you are good at and what you find tricky? Can you choose activities and equipment on your own? Can you ask for help when something becomes tricky? Can you talk about how something makes you feel? 	 Can you say how you look after your classroom? Can you talk about how your friends are different to you? (culture, needs, beliefs) Can you wait for your turn to speak? Can you say what makes a good listener?



A Parklands Person in Year 1 can...

 Can you talk to someone when you are concerned about something or someone? Can you talk about what you should do if you don't like something you see on the internet? Can you tell when one of your friends is feeling sad and try to help them? Can you make sure that your classroom is clean, tidy and safe? 	 Can you tell a friend what you like about their work? Can you share your ideas with your friends? Can you share equipment with your friends when working and playing? Can you give your friends advice? 	 Can you think of a different way of doing a task if it becomes tricky? Can you have a go at something new even if it seems hard or scary? Can you come up with your own ideas once given a starting point? Can you set yourself a target and say what you are trying to get better at? Can you independently choose resources which may help you? (word-mat, hundred square etc) 	 Can you listen carefully to instructions and follow them? Can you listen to others without interrupting? Can you listen to what someone else thinks during a disagreement? Can you pick the best time to talk to someone? 	 Can you give your opinion on a situation and explain why you feel that way? Can you say why you enjoyed or did not enjoy an activity? Can you give examples of how you are a Parklands Person? Can you ask for help if it is appropriate? 	 Can you talk about how you respect your local environment? Can you give examples of how to respect others? Can you name and talk about other faiths and beliefs? Can you recognise similarities and differences between others? Can you work cooperatively with a partner/group?

 Can you tell another child what they should do if they feel unsafe? Can you talk about how we can care for and keep our environment safe? Can you describe things you do to stay safe online? Can you help to keep younger children in school safe? 	 Can you suggest a way forward following a disagreement? Can you say how your actions may impact on others? Can you help a friend with their learning? Can you be responsible for a particular job in school? Can you help younger children with tasks in school? Can you share what you have learnt with others? 	 Can you think of more than one way to solve a problem? Can you make sure that you don't get distracted by others? Can you leave an activity and them come back to it when something is hard? Can you recognise when your work could have been done better? Can you say how you have acted on feedback? Can you happily make changes from an original idea? 	 Can you use different strategies to control your feelings? Can you make sure that all children in your group get a chance to talk about their ideas? Can you offer to help adults with tasks around school? Can you politely point out when you think someone may be wrong about something? Can you pick the best time to talk to someone? 	 Can you take the lead when working in a team? Can you think of questions to help you find out about something important to you? Can you explain why you have made one choice over another? Can you talk about what helps you to learn? 	 Can you talk about and compare other faiths? Can you show an interest in different faiths and beliefs and explain how these may be different to your own? Can you suggest improvements to the school and local environment? Can you remind others to be respectful by being a good role model? Can you talk about how we are all equal even though we are all different?
