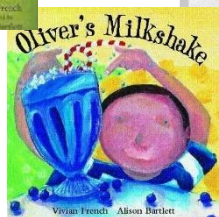
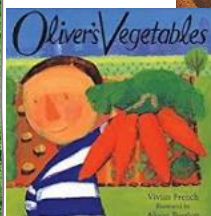
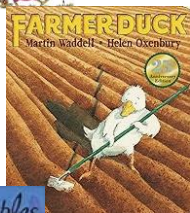
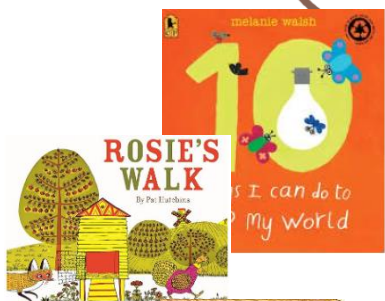
Summer One in Reception



Literacy

We will be exploring and sharing these stories:

We are reading...



We will be developing our writing skills by:

- Creating instructions to make a milkshake
- Labelling maps and writing directions through the forests
- Retelling stories
- Creating our woodland animal poems!

Mathematics

We will be...

- Exploring numbers beyond 10 to 20
- Solving addition and subtraction problems - How Many Now?
- Manipulate, compose and decompose numbers within 20
- Sharing objects into equal groups and finding half

Understanding the World

We will be...

- Learning about journeys and how these can be represented on a map
- Making our own maps
- Exploring how we can look after our planet and celebrating Earth Day
- Finding out what lives on a farm
- Learning where food comes from – farm to plate
- Making our very own milkshakes
- Making Healthy snacks

In RE we will be exploring which places are special and why.

Personal and Social Development

We will be exploring the theme of relationships in Jigsaw (Our PSHE programme)

This will cover:

- Making friends-
- Solving friendship problems
- Helping others feel part of a group
- Showing respect
- Know how to help themselves and others when they feel upset and hurt

Physical Development
